

## RCAC 333 Lord Beaverbrook Squadron, some history...

The Royal Canadian Air Cadets is a federally sponsored program for young Canadians ages 12 to 18 that are interested in participating in a variety of challenging and rewarding activities, and learning more about the Canadian Forces.

Encouraged to become active, responsible members of their communities, cadets learn valuable life and work skills like teamwork, leadership, and citizenship. They also reap the personal benefits of increased self-confidence and physical fitness, learning how to take initiative, and how to make decisions.

There are no registration fees, due, uniform costs or fees for the basic program. Cadets are not part of the Canadian Forces, nor are there any expectations for them to join the military.

On Monday, September 28, Fredericton Mayor, and former air cadet, Brad Woodside raised the cadet flag at Fredericton City Hall and formally proclaimed the week of September 27 to October 4 as Cadet Week in the New Brunswick capital .
